



Blitz and Pieces — WW2



Winston Churchill — was **Prime Minister** of the United Kingdom from 1940 to 1945, when he led Britain to victory in the Second **World War**, and again from 1951 to 1955.



Adolf Hitler— a German politician and leader of the Nazi Party. During his dictatorship from 1933 to 1945, he initiated World War II in Europe to **persuade** the Germans and the outside world to believe in his **re-gime**.



Benjamin Britten— Edward Benjamin Britten, Baron Britten was an English composer, conductor, and pianist. He was a central figure of 20th-century British classical music, with a range of works including opera, other vocal music, orchestral and chamber pieces. The **War Requiem**, is regarded by many as his masterpiece in the non-operatic sphere.



We use **primary** and **secondary** sources to help us know what life was like during World War Two.

Primary sources can be artefacts from that specific time period (they were there at the time) and first-hand accounts from people that lived at the time. Examples of this could be:

Ration books



Photographs



Secondary sources are informative about the time but are not from that time period. We use books and the internet as secondary sources.



The Blitz - was Nazi Germany's sustained aerial bombing campaign against Britain in World War Two. The raids killed 43,000 civilians and lasted for eight months. 2,000,000 people were made homeless as a result of the bombings and 60% of these were in London.



Evacuation— the withdrawal or removal of troops or civilians

Civilian—person not belonging to the armed forces

Refugee— a person who seeks shelter, in another country, during a time of war, disaster or persecution

Rationing— a policy of allowing each person to have a fixed amount of food

Propaganda—spreading a particular message in order to influence people

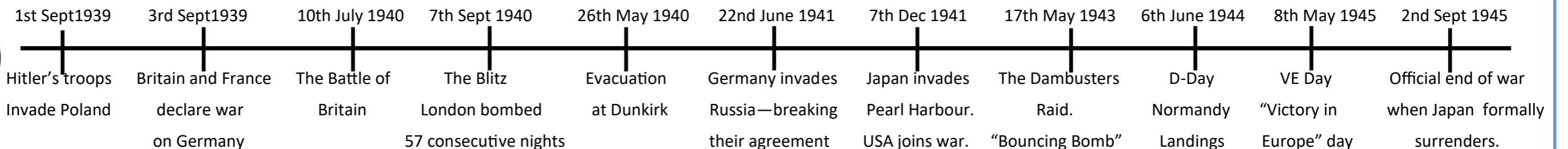
Science:
