Remember to read at least 3-4 times a week. Ask an adult to write in your reading record.

Imagine you live in the Stone Age. What would life be like in each of the different seasons? Draw a picture for each of the seasons eg. For winter you might be cosy in a cave or hunting in the snow.

Research, draw and label an animal that lived during the Stone Age. (Stone Age animals include woolly mammoths, sabre toothed tiger and reindeer.)


Make your own or a family timeline. Place important dates along the time line.
