Remember to read at least 3-4 times a week. Ask an adult to write in your reading record.

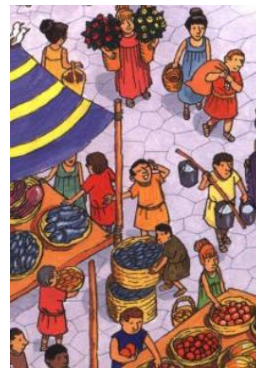
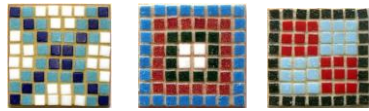
SPELLINGS
